## Voice to Parliament Referendum Roadshow to get underway in the Pilbara

The Yamatji Marlpa Aboriginal Corporation will be providing an opportunity for communities to learn more about the Voice to Parliament in September through its Pilbara Referendum Roadshow.

Travelling through five towns with 11 events in the Pilbara region, the Roadshow will include information on how the Referendum came about; the referendum question, what a successful Yes vote will mean for First Nations people, what the Voice will (and won't) do, and what will happen after the Referendum.

The Pilbara Voice Referendum Roadshow is held from the 4 to 14 September, visiting Onslow, Karratha, Port Hedland, Tom Price and Newman.

YMAC Deputy Co-chairperson, Pilbara Region Mrs. Doris Eaton will join some of the roadshow events in the Pilbara. She said, "We know a lot of people have said they just don't know enough about it to make a decision on how to vote. The roadshows will provide a forum to learn more, ask questions, and have a yarn with our speakers so they feel confident writing YES on Referendum Day."

All Roadshow events will feature a panel discussion. Invited to join YMAC on the roadshow will be community leaders and representatives from the YES23 campaign.

The Pilbara Referendum Roadshow is an opportunity for all Australians in the Pilbara region to understand the positive difference the Voice to Parliament will make for First Nations people. Everyone is welcome to attend.
